

COOKIE POLICY

Mullany Walsh Maxwells respects the privacy of all visitors to our website. This Cookie Policy outlines our policy concerning the use of cookies on mwmlegal.ie. We may update our Cookie Policy from time to time to reflect any changes in technology or legislation which may affect the way in which cookies are used by us and how you as a user, can manage them.

1. What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files sent from a website and stored in the user's web browser while the user is browsing a website. When users visit the same website again, the browser sends cookies back to the website allowing the website to recognise the user and remember things like personalised details or preferences.

Cookies may be either "persistent" cookies or "session" cookies. A persistent cookie consists of a text file sent by a web server to a web browser, which will be stored by the browser and will remain valid until its set expiry date (unless deleted by the user before the expiry date). A session cookie, on the other hand, will expire at the end of the user session, when the web browser is closed.

Cookies may be used to enable us to estimate usage numbers, patterns and related activity. They may also be used to store information about how you accessed and use our website, and so allow us to customise our website for your benefit.

Information about your general Internet usage may be obtained by using a cookie file which is stored on the hard drive of your computer. Cookies contain information that is transferred to your computer's hard drive.

2. Performance cookies

These cookies are used to collect statistical information about visitors of the website and the pages they view. These cookies don't collect information that identifies a visitor. All information these cookies collect is aggregated and used anonymously. We use these cookies to understand what content is popular which helps us to improve our website.

We may use analytical services such as Google Analytics to provide this service, which uses four first party cookies. The data collected is not shared with any other party. Web beacons may also be used and these facilitate the transfer of data from the website to the analytics provider.

Information collected may be transmitted to and stored by Google or other analytics providers on servers outside the EEA. They may also transfer this information to third parties where required to do so by law, or where such third parties process the information on their behalf.
